### Cameron County Confirms Additional COVID-19 Related Deaths

Cameron County has received confirmation of an additional COVID-19 related death of a Cameron County resident. The individuals were an 88-year-old female and a 76-year old male from Brownsville and a 58-year-old female from Harlingen. They were previously reported cases. This raises the total number of COVID-19 related deaths to thirty-nine (39).

Cameron County has received confirmation of an additional 21 case reports of COVID-19. This includes the following:

This raises the total number of COVID-19 cases to 820 in Cameron County. There have also been an additional eighteen (18) individuals who have recovered, raising the total number of recovered individuals to 599.

Cameron County Public Health continues to work with the three nursing home facilities in addressing the COVID-19 outbreaks. To date, the Cameron County cases arising from the Veranda Nursing Home has included 32 employees and 61 residents who have tested positive, including eleven (11) who have passed away. The Windsor Atrium currently has 39 employees and 61 residents who have tested positive, including sixteen (16) individuals who have passed away. Spanish Meadows in Brownsville also has six (6) employees and eleven (11) residents who have tested positive.

As part of the COVID-19 action response plan, Cameron County Public Health is conducting epidemiological investigations, contact tracing as needed, and continues to monitor the situation.
